McCrae Yacht Club Child Safety Policy

This policy was approved by the **General Committee** of **McCrae Yacht Club** at its meeting on **17 February 2017.**

OUR COMMITMENT TO CHILD SAFETY

Our organisation is committed to child safety.

We are committed to the safety, participation and empowerment of all children. We support and respect all children, as well as our staff and volunteers.

We have zero tolerance of child abuse, and all allegations and safety concerns will be treated very seriously and consistently with our policies and procedures.

We have legal and moral obligations to contact authorities when we are worried about a child's safety, which we follow rigorously.

Our organisation is committed to preventing child abuse and identifying risks early, and removing and reducing these risks.

We support and respect all children, as well as our staff and volunteers. We are committed to the cultural safety of Aboriginal children, the cultural safety of children from a culturally and/or linguistically diverse backgrounds, and to providing a safe environment for children with a disability.

If you believe a child is at immediate risk of abuse phone 000.

PURPOSE OF THIS POLICY

This policy guides our staff and volunteers on how to behave with children in our organisation.

All of our staff and volunteers must agree to abide by our code of conduct which specifies the standards of conduct required when working with children.

We take all reasonable steps to employ skilled people to work with children. Our organisation understands that when recruiting staff and volunteers we have ethical as well as legislative obligations.

We actively encourage applications from Aboriginal peoples, people from culturally and/or linguistically diverse backgrounds and people with a disability.

All people engaged in the Club's sail training centre, including volunteers, are required to hold a Working with Children Check and to provide evidence of this Check.

EXTENT OF THIS POLICY

This policy applies to all employees and members of McCrae Yacht Club.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Our organisation takes our legal responsibilities seriously, including:

- Failure to disclose: Reporting child sexual abuse is a community-wide responsibility. All adults in Victoria who have a reasonable belief that an adult has committed a sexual offence against a child under 16 have an obligation to report that information to the police.
- **Failure to protect:** People of authority in our organisation will commit an offence if they know of a substantial risk of child sexual abuse and have the power or responsibility to reduce or remove the risk, but negligently fail to do so.

RESPONDING TO BREACHES OF THE POLICY

Our organisation takes all allegations seriously and has practices in place to investigate thoroughly and quickly.

We all have a responsibility to report an allegation of abuse if we have a reasonable belief that an incident took place (see information about failure to disclose above).

If an adult has a **reasonable belief** that an incident has occurred then they must report the incident. Factors contributing to reasonable belief may be:

- a child states they or someone they know has been abused (noting that sometimes the child may in fact be referring to themselves)
- behaviour consistent with that of an abuse victim is observed
- someone else has raised a suspicion of abuse but is unwilling to report it
- observing suspicious behaviour.

McCrae Yacht Club Child Safety Code of Conduct

All staff, volunteers and committee members of McCrae Yacht Club are required to observe child safe principles and expectations for appropriate behaviour towards and in the company of children by:

- adhering to the Club's child safe policy at all times and upholding it's statement of commitment to child safety at all times
- taking all reasonable steps to protect children from abuse
- treating everyone with respect
- listening and responding to the views and concerns of children, particularly
 if they are telling you that they or another child has been abused and/or are
 worried about their safety or the safety of another
- promoting the cultural safety, participation and empowerment of Aboriginal children and children with culturally and/or linguistically diverse backgrounds by having a zero tolerance of discrimination
- reporting any allegations of child abuse to the police and the Club's leadership
- if an allegation of child abuse is made, ensure as quickly as possible that the child or children are safe
- encouraging children to 'have a say' and participate in all relevant organisational activities where possible, especially on issues that are important to them.

Staff and volunteers must not:

- exhibit behaviours with children which may be construed as unnecessarily physical
- put children at risk of abuse (for example, by locking doors)
- do things of a personal nature that a child can do for themselves, such as toileting or changing clothes
- engage in open discussions of a mature or adult nature in the presence of children (for example, personal social activities)
- use inappropriate language in the presence of children
- express personal views on cultures, race or sexuality in the presence of children
- discriminate against any child, including because of culture, race, ethnicity or disability
- ignore or disregard any suspected or disclosed child abuse.
